This lab developed out of partnerships with the College of Forestry [Now College of Natural Resources] & the Idaho State 4-H Office at the University of Idaho; 4-H at Washington State University, Oregon State University and Montana State University. It is focused on leadership education in a natural resource setting using recreation as a framework. It serves 13 western states. It is slow paced and reflective.

We ask that you be respectful and considerate by not interrupting sessions or activities. Please be on time for all facets of lab.

Workshops: Class locations announced daily. Workshops may have participant limits, age requirements and/or fees. Silence phones and do not use electronics during classes, workshops or activities.

Facilities: Please enjoy the amenities but leave them in the best possible condition to show our gratitude for using Twinlow Camp. If you move furniture for classes, return it by the end of the week. If you see litter, please put it in trash or recycle bins. Report any damaged facilities or equipment.
